What is a Practice-Based Research Network, or PBRN?

A PBRN is a network of healthcare providers, practices, and academic research institutes dedicated to improving the health of their communities by doing research that matters to the community.

- PBRNs build and maintain partnerships in research, utilizing the best local expertise and innovative ideas.
- PBRNs translate practice-based research into practical tools for improving health.
- PBRNs provide opportunities to work together with many people and enrich practice experiences.

How do I submit a proposal to the WVPBRN?

To submit a full proposal to the WVPBRN, you must following the link below to the online application, which allows you to upload the proposal information as well as address how the project is useful to WVPBRN members.

How long does the review process take to become a WVPBRN project?

The WVPBRN has a two-step review process. The proposals are reviewed by committees specifically for relevance to the network and feasibility within primary care settings. The review process takes a minimum of 60 days to obtain feedback from these committees and deliver a decision.

Who reviews the proposal?

The WVPBRN has two committees that provide feedback in various aspects of the project. The General Advisory Committee reviews the project in terms of relevance to the network mission, values and goals set by the network as a whole. The Protocol Review Committee evaluates the feasibility of the project within the primary care settings and clinical workflow. If necessary, the committees will provide feedback and time will be given for edits to be made to the proposal.

What resources does the WVPBRN membership include?

WVPBRN members receive a monthly newsletter that updates and informs members on current and upcoming projects. It also provides information on training opportunities and practice-based strategies in research.

Members are also offered a courtesy appointment at West Virginia University School of Medicine Department of Clinical and Translational Science. This grants access to the West Virginia University library resources. The WVPBRN also provides an online discussion forum for members to share information and discuss topics of interest.
